Steven Edward is the presenter for our next membership meeting on Wednesday, October 19.

Did you know that the Burbank Tournament of Roses Association is one of only six Self-Built float builders, meaning 100% volunteer built and decorated? The other floats are commercially built with paid labor.

Our guest speaker, Steven Edward, who is currently the Vice President-Float for the Burbank Tournament of Roses Association,

got his float building start in 1986 as a student at Cal Poly Pomona, another one of the Self-Built Float Builders. He is going to share with us the how, when, what and design of BTORA floats.

How - do they build the float?
When - do they start working on the float?
What - do they use to build the float?
Designing a float?

After graduating from Cal Poly, Steve moved to Burbank and accepted a job at Warner Bros. in 1989. He still works in the Technology department for Warner Bros. Discovery on the Burbank Lot.

Steve joined the Burbank Tournament of Roses in 1991 and within a few years became the Vice President-Float, a position that he has held most of this time. The Vice President-Float oversees various float committees including the Design Contest, Float Design, Construction, Decorations, Riders, Site and Safety and Manpower. In addition, he maintains the Association's website, answers all of its emails and publishes a monthly email update to all volunteers.




