Gallery, I'd never met her until the Fine Arts Federation's annual show last spring. Chatting about printmaking, we realized that we had both gone to University of Washington around the same time. Glad you got introduced to her work.



Speaking of work, the Fall Show is around the corner and I hope that you've been busy, creating masterpieces to submit. Note to ceramicists and sculptors, this is your shining hour; the BLCAC has space and plinths galore for you to exhibit your work.

We finally find ourselves in October country, best described by Ray Bradbury as "that country where the hills are fog and the rivers are mist; where noons go quickly, dusks and twilights linger, and midnights stay." October would be a good month to revisit Leonora Carrington's work. Carrington came from a well-healed British family. Her artistic rebellion landed her on the Continent where she encountered the Surrealists, notably André Breton, Max Ernst and Paul Éluard. She and Ernst fed each other's creative impulses in a rather stormy relationship until the German occupation scattered them. She spent most of her creative life

in Mexico City, where she sculpted and painted. Her most famous painting is a self-portrait called "The Inn of the Dawn Horse."

Also, a sad good-bye to our member, Kathy Phipps. She was very ill and succumbed this past Sunday, September 22nd. She was far too young to have the

burdens she had. She powered through with the help of her art and enjoyed it to the very end.

A scientist, a rebel and friend, she will be missed.

We may try to do a posthumous exhibition, if her family agrees.



This show is for current BAA members who have paid their membership dues by the October 16, 2019 BAA general meeting. We will not accept membership payments at the Take-in.

Art Drop Off: Monday, October 28, 9am to 12pm

at the BLCAC.

Please be prompt. No entries will be accepted after 12 o'clock.

One entry per artist. \$20.00 for one entry.

Artists' Reception with Awards: Friday, November 1 at the BLCAC, 7-9pm.

We will have a Sign-up sheet for refreshments at the October meeting.

Artists entering the competition are expected to attend. Ribbon awards will be presented to

First, Second and Third place, plus Honorable Mentions.

Note: If there are less than 4 entries in one category, there will only be one award in that category. If the art entry fits reasonably well into another category, it may be moved into that one, at the discretion of the judge.

Categories: Open Division: Landscape/Seascape/Cityscape, Still Life/Floral, Life/Genre,

Contemporary/Abstract, Sculpture and Photography.

Honors Division: Floral/Genre/Still Life, Seascape/Cityscape, Abstract/Contemporary.

Take-Down and Pick-Up: Friday, Nov 15, 9am-12pm.


All submissions must meet the Creative Art Center rules & regulations:

- Frames all work should be properly framed, or the canvas edges nicely painted. No saw-tooth hangers, nails or tapes
- Mats neutral colors, neatly cut, no colored mats (Colored liners are acceptable)
- Cover watercolors, drawings and other easily damaged work with glass, or Plexiglas if 18 x 24" or larger
- **Ceramic/Glasswork** All pieces must be fired, and auxiliary pieces securely attached. Work must not contain sharp points or edges and must be securely attached to pedestals with quake mount.
- Most important: All work must have proper hanging wires as always!

A detailed checklist and "Intent-to Enter" sheet will be available for everyone at the October meeting on the 16th together with the new entry forms.


