# President's Message



Dear Fellow Artists,

We've reached February - midwinter and the midpoint of our association's year. We've had lots of exhibit opportunities thanks to hard work on the part of some of our members: Helena Bowman, Wendy Wallace, Joanna Lewis. I certainly hope you're supporting your fellow artists by attending as many openings as you can and visiting their

exhibits independently;

This month we will calling for volunteers to form a nominating committee to elect our Board of Directors for next year. We will be electing new board members and reelecting those who decide to continue their positions. The Financial Secretary position has been open for some time now. Speaking of the Financial Secretary, we are having trouble chasing down commissions on work sold at our exhibits and events. Let's get those payments in.

We also will be getting ready to solicit entries for our scholarships. Joanna is in charge of that, but we need volunteers for a committee to review portfolios and resumes. Let's not confuse this with the annual prize that we award the best senior work at the BLCAC's Youth Expo in the spring. Stay tuned for more info on that.

For the artist of the month, I chose Augusta Savage, artist, activist, and arts educator. Born in Florida, she was discouraged from creating pieces from clay, which her father thought were "graven images". Fortunately, she was undeterred by family pressure and lack of funds. She was granted a scholarship at Cooper Union. After Cooper, she did commissions (notably a bust of Marcus Garvey) while she worked in a steam laundry to support her family. With bronze being so expensive, she mostly worked in clay or plaster. For the 1939 World's Fair, she created an installation in plaster called *Lift Every Voice and Sing\**, which was sadly destroyed at end of fair along with most of the other installations. Models still exist for the piece, one of which I have posted here, along with *Gamin*, one of her most well-known pieces

Pete Morris has been known as the "Metro Artist". His demos are always entertaining as well as informative!

Pete Morris is passionate about watercolor and has been painting for more than 20 years. He works-full time as a graphic artist for a silkscreen printing company and paints watercolors during his lunch breaks, on the drive home from work, on weekends and evenings, whenever he can squeeze it in. The result is hundreds of watercolors painted each year. Whenever possible, he paints on location, "plein air", but he also does work in his studio. He is known




for his Rte. 66 series, paintings of scenes along the historic highway. Recently, Pete has had exhibits at Vroman's Bookstore Pasadena, Azusa Pacific University, Artshare LA in the Arts District, Archives Bookstore in Pasadena and Sierra Madre City Hall. He posts his ongoing work almost every day on Facebook. Pete has self-published two books. One is called Curbside LA, and is sketches of Los Angeles neighborhoods done to and from work and during his lunch hour. The second is called Riding the Metro and is sketches of people in their environment on Metro trains and buses.
