With the current pandemic situation and the various recommendations for limiting its spread, perhaps as artists we are fortunate to have a hobby/vocation that adapts more easily than most to the required restrictions. I refer to the early and often recommendation to stay home (or, in our case) to stay in whatever studio we have available. In my case, it's the kitchen table. Having more time than we might have otherwise to do our artistic thing(s) is actually a good thing in many ways. For those of you who are doing art for commercial purposes, this time can be used to further

experiment with new techniques and subject matter that might be of interest to buyers.

We are not without communication, of course. Using the Internet in various ways, including the ever-present Zoom conferencing, along with your own web sites and social media, it's still possible to keep in touch with friends, members, and family, and to share with them your latest projects and ideas. In the September general Zoom meeting (organized by Stefanie Girard and hosted by Karen Sachs), presenter Kristine Schomaker spoke to these methods, and felt that of them, having your own web site was far and away the best method to provide a "base" to your promotional efforts. If you are interested in such a project, let me know and we can make some suggestions on how to go about it.

In other articles in this newsletter by Joanna Lewis and Ellie Klein, we have lots of information about how to participate in our current exhibitions. With regard to the Fall Show at the Betsy Lueke Creative Arts Center, if you need a photo to submit for the catalog, take a picture of your piece with your cell phone and send it to <a href="webmaster@burbankartassociation.org">webmaster@burbankartassociation.org</a>. Send the largest file you can – some phones let you select how big a file (size of digital picture) you wish to send. We will try to edit it as needed for the catalog entry.

There will be a Winter Isolation Gallery in December featuring a holiday theme. We will advise you when it's available.

#### GEO GALLERY NEWS ~ Joanna Lewis



October Zoom meeting will be an interactive session guided by Artist Bryan Mahoney.

#### Art for fun, for myself and for money

Your art could be viewed in Bangladesh tomorrow. In fact, it might already be there!

The last 30 years have transformed the way in which artists market their art, and the way in which people consume it. These same factors have made artists out of people that never knew they had talents lying dormant like colored paints covered by an old varnish.

Bryan Mahoney came to art much later in his life than he planned. He is a former journalist, having written for the LA Times, Glendale News-Press and Burbank Leader, among other publications. In the last three years he went from his first formal art lesson to designing commercial products and launching his own line of gifts and pop art.

In this interactive session he'll show you how to take advantage of some simple modern tools to spread the word about your art. By the end of his talk you'll be itching to get back to the canvas, the clay, or the cow's milk. Because yes, there is art in cheese, there is art in computer spreadsheets, there is art everywhere in life.

Art materials recommended for the meeting:

- 1) A sheet of white paper or cardstock (40 lb is best)
- 2) A pencil with a good eraser
- 3) A fine tip pen (not a brush pen) Microns work great (005 to 08)
